


Welcome to the Monash Health 2023 Orientation Program for Interns

The focus of the Monash Health orientation program is to ensure your readiness for work. The objectives include:

- Enable interns to have some awareness of the roles other health professions play within the team

Prior to the commencement of O-week, you need to ensure you have already done the following: Customise your Monash Health login password. You will have already received an email with instructions. This is critical to your O-Week, as it links to your Microsoft Teams account to access the online sessions and access to all IT systems at Monash Health. Download the Microsoft teams app...
